Is cúis áthais dom é an deis seo a ghlacadh chun súil a chaitheamh siar ar bhliain rathúil eile a bhí ag Gaisce agus táim ag súil go mór leis an gcomóradh fiche cúig bliana a cheiliúradh in 2010.

Is mór an t-ábhar misnigh dom an díograis leanúnach atá ag rannpháirtithe agus cinnirí Gaisce a fheiceáil fiú agus leis an timpeallacht gheilleagrach dheacair atá rompu. Léirítear go soiléir le gradam Gaisce uailmhian agus tiomantas an duine óig do na caighdeáin is airde. Sa lá atá inniu ann agus an méid iomaíochta atá i gceist, is comhartha é gradam Gaisce d'fhostóirí agus institiúidí acadúla féideartha go bhfuil tionscnaíocht agus spreagthacht ag an duine a fuair an gradam chun spriocanna pearsanta dúshlánacha a leagan síos agus go bhfuil an fhéith agus buanseasmhacht iontu chun iad a bhaint amach.

Anois fiche cúig bliana bainte amach, leanann Gaisce ag spreagadh daoine óga ar fud na hÉireann, ag cur dúshlán rompu agus ag tabhairt ionsparáide dóibh. Tá iliomad cúiseanna ann ar éirigh chomh maith le Gaisce, ach an chúis is mó ná toilteanas agus diongbháilteacht líon mór daoine óga a chuireann iad féin faoi thriail agus iad ar thuras féinfhollasaithe. Nil sé éasac ar chor ar bith gradam a bhaint amach; éilítear fiorthiomantas agus díograis leanúnach thar tréimhse fada. Gach bliain, leagann na rannpháirtithe spriocanna amach ina gcuirfead faoi dhúshlán iad go fisiciúil agus go meabhrach, spriocanna ina bhfuil diongbháilteacht, misneach agus crógacht de dhíth. Agus na dúshlán seo á mbaint amach, ní hamháin go gcuireann na rannpháirtithe feabhas orthu féin mar shaoránaigh ghníomhacha; ach tá ionchur an-luachmhar á dhéanamh acu ina scoileanna, coláistí agus pobail. Gné rithábhachtach eile de Gaisce is ea Ceannairí Ghradam an Uachtaráin (PALanna), oibríthe deonacha a thugann an méid sin ama agus tiomantais le dul in éineacht leis na rannpháirtithe ar a dturas. Gabhaim buíochas leo as an gceannasaíocht agus tacaíocht atá léirithe acu. Chomh maith leis sin, is mian liom buíochas a ghabháil le foireann Gaisce, a rinne obair den scoth faoi threoir an Chathaoirigh agus na Comhairle le beogacht agus ábharthacht na ngradam a chinntiú.

Ba mhaith liom comhghairdeas faoi leith a dhéanamh leis na rannpháirtithe uile, na PALanna agus oifigigh Gaisce don obair iontach a rinne siad in 2009 agus guím gach rath oraibh amach anseo.

Réamhrá an Chathaoirligh

Is mór an onóir dom Tuarascáil Bhliantúil Gaisce – Gradam an Uachtaráin – 2009 a chur faoi do bhráid.

Ba bhliain ghnóthach í 2009 do Gaisce agus ba bhliain an-deacair í leis an gcor chun donais eacnamaíoch a tharla dúinn. Leis an bhfás leanúnach i gcúrsaí dífhostaíochta, go háirithe i measc daoine óga, leagtar tuilleadh béime ar thábhacht na hoibre a dhéanaimid i measc daoine óga chun iad a chur chun cinn i gcúrsaí oideachais agus lena mbonn scileanna.

I mbliana, 2010, beidh 25 bliana bainte amach ó cuireadh tús le Gaisce. Ó bunaíodh é i 1985 tá níos mó ná 100,000 Gradam bainte amach ag ár ndaoine óga. Ba mhaith liom ómós a thabhairt do na mílte duine a rinne ionchur ar leith agus ionchur suntasach leis an nGradam a chruthú mar atá sé inniu. Tá sé beartaithe againn na mórghníomhartha seo a chomórath trí bhealaí éagsúla. Ceann amháin díobh seo ná bronnadh a dhéanfaidh an tUachtarán Mhic Ghiolla Íosa de bhonn a bheidh ainmnithe chun onóir a thabhairt dár bpátrún bunaidh, an tUachtarán Pádraig Ó hIrlhile agus dóibh siúd a thug seirbhís 25 bliana do chlár an Ghradam agus tá sé beartaithe againn go mbeidh sé ina imeacht bliantúil.

Le linn na bliana leanamar leis an ngaol a fhorbairt idir sinn agus ár gcomheagraíocht i dTuaisceart Éireann, Gradam Duke of Edinburgh. Leanamar freisin leis an gcaidreamh a fhorbairt atá againn leis an eagraíocht domhanda agus le Cumann Ghradam *Duke of Edinburgh*. Is mó an luach é seo dúinn le coinneáil ar an eolas maidir leis na forbairtí éagsúla thar an 129 tír ina bhfuil an Gradam ag feidhmiú anois, agus leis na caighdeáin dea-chleachtais a fhorbairt freisin.

Tá achoimre ar ár Ráiteas Airgeadais mar a bhí iniúchta ag PriceWaterhouseCoopers do 2009 leagtha amach ar leathanaigh 27 agus 28.

An t-ioncam iomlán don bhliain ba ea €1.12 milliún – laghdú beag ó 2008. An t-athrú ba mhó ba ea laghdú €73,000 i ndeontas an Rialtais. Chomh maith leis sin, mar fhreagra ar na cúinsí geilleagracha a bhí go dona, chinneamar, mar bheart sealadach amháin, gan an comórtas gailf a reáchtáil i 2009. Caiteachas iomlán don bhliain ba ea €1.07 milliún – laghdú de níos mó ná €100,000 ón mbliain roimhe.

Chairman's Introduction

I am very pleased to present to you the 2009 Annual Report of Gaisce – The President's Award.

This has been a busy year for Gaisce and a very difficult one with the severe economic down turn which we have experienced. The persistent growth in unemployment, particularly amongst younger people, emphasises even more the importance of the work we do amongst young people in furthering their education and skill base.

The current year 2010 marks the 25th anniversary of the creation of the Award. Since its establishment in 1985 close to 100,000 Awards have been earned by our young people. I would like to pay a very sincere tribute to the thousands of people who have made such varying and significant contributions to making the Award what it is today. We are planning to mark this achievement in various ways. One of these will be the presentation by President McAleese of a medal named to honour our founding patron President Patrick Hillery to those who have given 25 years service to the Award programme and we plan this to be an annual event.

During the year we have continued to develop our relationship with our partner organisation the Duke of Edinburgh's Award in Northern Ireland. We have also continued to develop our interaction with the world organisation the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Association. This is valuable to us in keeping us informed of various developments across the 129 countries in which the Award now operates and in developing standards of best practice.

A summary of our Financial Statement as audited by PriceWaterhouseCoopers for 2009 is set out on pages 27 and 28.

Our total income for the year amounted to €1.12 million – a small decrease on 2008. The biggest change was a reduction of €73,000 in the Government grant. In addition, in response to the severe economic conditions we decided, as a purely temporary measure, not to hold the golf challenge in 2009. Total expenditure for the year amounted to €1.07 million – a decrease of over €100,000 from the previous year.

An tAire Leanaí agus Gnóthaí Óige Mar gheall ar na cúinsí reatha bhí an feidhmeannas an-aireach agus an caiteachas á rialú agus leis an ioncam a uasmhéadú. Le linn na gcúinsí seo ba inmholta é barrachas €45,336 a bhaint amach don bhliain.

Léirítear staid shásúil leis an gClár Comhardaithe mar a bhí ar 31 Nollaig 2009. Níl dallamullóg ar bith orainn, áfach, maidir leis na deacrachtaí atá romhainn sa bhliain reatha 2010. Tá gá le bheith aireach go leanúnach maidir le gach mír caiteachais agus ioncaim.

Is gné rithábachtach í an tacaíocht fhorleathan dheonach a thugann líon mór daoine do Gaisce inár gcuid oibre le daoine óga a chumasú ionas gur féidir leo an acmhainneacht atá iontu a bhaint amach. Agus buíochas á ghabháil libh ar fad, ba mhaith liom buíochas ar leith a ghabháil leis na daoine seo a leanas;

An tUachtarán Máire Mhic Ghiolla Íosa don spreagadh iontach a thug sí agus don tiomantas atá aici dár gcuid oibre agus don Dr. Martin Mac Giolla Íosa a thugann an-chuid tacaíochta dúinn agus atá an-fhlaitiúil lena chuid ama.

An 800 Ceannaire Gradaim den Uachtaráin atá againn a léiríonn tacaíocht dheonach iontach dár rannpháirtithe.

An Chomhairle atá againn atá chomh flaitiúil agus a cuid ama agus scileanna á dtabhairt dúinn ar son Gaisce.

Na Comhaltaí Comhairleacha, na tabharthóirí agus an lucht tacaíochta atá againn.

An Roinn Sláinte agus Leanaí.

Ar deireadh, thar ceann na Comhairle is mian liom ár mbuíochas a ghabháil lenár bPríomhfheidhmeannach atá chomh tiomanta sin, Barney Callaghan, agus leis an bhfoireann uile atá againn, atá chomh díograiseach, agus a théann níos faide ná mar atá de chúram orthu.

Tuairisc an Phríomhfheidhmeannaigh

Is cúis pribhléide dom í ionchur a bheith agam sa Tuarascáil Bhliantúil seo ag deireadh bliana a bhí an-dúshlánach ach ar éirigh thar cionn le Gaisce. Clárúcháin nua ba ea 16,667 (ardú 16.9%) don na Gradaim Cré-Umha, Airgid agus Óir agus bronnadh 7,416 Gradam ag searmanais Ghradaim ar fud na tíre:: 6,784 Gradam Cré-Umha, 580 Gradam Airgid agus 52 Gradam Óir. Bhí líon mór de mhuintir mór-le-rá na hÉireann a thug a gcuid ama go flaithiúil le Gradam an Uachtaráin de Gaisce a bhronnadh ar dhaoine óga.

Thug baill de Tar Éis Óir (TÉÓ), sealbhóirí Gradaim Óir agus rannpháirtithe Gradaim eile tacaíocht do Gaisce ag imeachtaí náisiúnta iomráiteacha agus éagsúla agus bhí siad rannpháirteach in imeachtaí idirnáisiúnta ar fud na hEorpa. Bhí ionadaithe ag Gaisce ag an bhfóram Gradaim Idirnáisiúnta san Astráil agus bhí sealbhóirí an Ghradaim Óir Iárnach do dhearadh agus reáchtáil na Comhdhála Eorpaí ar an mBeartas don Óige a bhí ar siúl sa Ríocht Aontaithe. Bhí ball TÉÓ atá ag obair in Kosovo a d'éascaigh é do Gaisce le triúr rannpháirtithe Gradaim ó Kosovo a chlárú chun tús a chur lena nGradam sula gcuirfear tús leis an nGradam ina dtír féin.

Le forfheidhmiú de chéim a trí d'athbhreithniú cáilíochta, atá bunaithe ar na caighdeáin, curtha i gcrích chomh maith le hathbhreithniú ginearálta ar ár gcaighdeáin, mar chuid dár gcreidiúnú le Cumann Idirnáisiúnta na nGradam (IAA), tá Gaisce comhlíontach go hiomlán anois. D'éirigh le Gaisce deontas do Thionscadail ar Leith de Stg£8,000 a fháil ón IAA le dul chun cinn a dhéanamh ar an acmhainn oiliúna atá againn.

Tá fás leanúnach ag teacht ar an bhfáil atá ar na Gradaim Gaisce i dTuaisceart Éireann agus tá fás agus forbairt ag teacht ar an ngaol atá againn lenár gcomhghleacaithe sa Ghradam Duke of Edinburgh i dTuaisceart Éireann.

Tá Óglaigh na hÉireann ag tacú le Gaisce le beagnach fiche cúig bliana agus fuair fiche a sé duine óg taithí saoil as an turas eachtraíochta bliantúil a rinne siad, a d'éascaigh foireann an zú Reisimint Airtléire Machaire lena gcuid saineolais. Leanamar lenár

Chief Executive's Report

I am greatly honoured to contribute to this Annual Report at the end of a very challenging and successful year for Gaisce. New registrations reached **16,667 (16.9% increase)** for Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards and at Award ceremonies throughout the country 7,416 Awards were presented: **6,784** Bronze, **580** Silver and **52** Gold. A variety of people prominent in Irish life generously gave of their time to present Gaisce President's Award to young people.

Tar Éis Óir (TÉÓ) members, Gold Award holders and other Award participants supported Gaisce at a variety of high profile national events and they participated in international events across Europe. Gaisce was represented at the International Award forum in Australia and Gold Award holders were central to the design and delivery of a European Conference on Youth Policy in the UK. A TÉÓ member working in Kosovo facilitated Gaisce to register three Award participants from Kosovo to commence their Award in advance of the Award being setup in their own country.

The implementation of phase three of a standards based review of quality was completed and a general review of our standards, as part of our accreditation with the International Award Association (IAA), sees Gaisce fully compliant. Gaisce secured a Stg£8,000 International Special Projects grant from the IAA to further the development of our training capacity.

Access to Gaisce Awards continues to grow in Northern Ireland and our relationship with our colleagues in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award in Northern Ireland is continuing to grow and develop.

The Defence Forces have supported Gaisce for almost twenty five years and the annual adventure journey provided twenty six young people with the experience of a lifetime, expertly facilitated by the personnel of the 2nd Field Artillery Regiment. We continued to develop our relationship with An Garda Síochána and were delighted to send a Garda delegation to view the operation of the Award at

gcaidreamh leis an nGarda Síochána a fhorbairt agus ba chúis áthais í dúinn toscaireacht den Gharda Síochána a chur chun amharc ar fheidhmiú an Ghradaim ag Acadamh Phóilíní na Tuirce. Tá Gaisce an-bhuíoch de Cheann Foirne Óglaigh na hÉireann, an Leifteanant Ghinearál Dermot Earley agus Coimisinéir na nGardaí Fachtna Murphy don síorthacaíocht leanúnach a thugann siad dúinn.

Tá príomhfhoilseacháin uile Gaisce i nGaeilge agus i mBéarla agus leanaimid ar aghaidh agus forbairt á déanamh ar ár n-acmhainn Ghaeilge.

Cuirtear go mór leis an íomhá atá againn agus an obair a dhéanaimid trí thacaíocht leanúnach agus inspioráideach a fháil ónár bpátrún an tUachtarán Máire Mhic Ghiolla Íosa agus a fear céile an Dr. Martin Mac Giolla Íosa agus leis an tacaíocht agus ceannasaíocht luachmhar seo déantar sinn a neartú sa chomhthéacs idirnáisiúnta.

Ní bheadh Gaisce ann mar atá sé, ná ní bheadh sé chomh héifeachtach is atá sé, mar chlár forbartha pearsanta do dhaoine óga, ach amháin leis an obair fhlaithiúil agus neamhleithleach atá déanta ag Ceannairí Ghradam an Uachtaráin (PALanna) a oibríonn go deonach. Glacaim buíochas leo as an méid a dhéanann siad agus as an ionchur a dhéanann siad leis an tsochaí a fhorbairt san oileán seo.

Táim an-bhuíoch den Chomhairle a oibríonn ar bhonn dheonach don tacaíocht leanúnach a thugann siad dúinn agus den Chathaoirleach Dr. Laurence Crowley don cheannasaíocht agus tiomantas a léiríonn sé i dtreo obair Gaisce.

Ar deireadh, ní mór dom aitheantas a thabhairt do mo chomhoibrithe agus mo chuid cairde calma in Gaisce agus buíochas a ghabháil leo as an tiomantas leanúnach a léiríonn siad do na daoine óga a bhfreastalaímid orthu mar cheannairí. 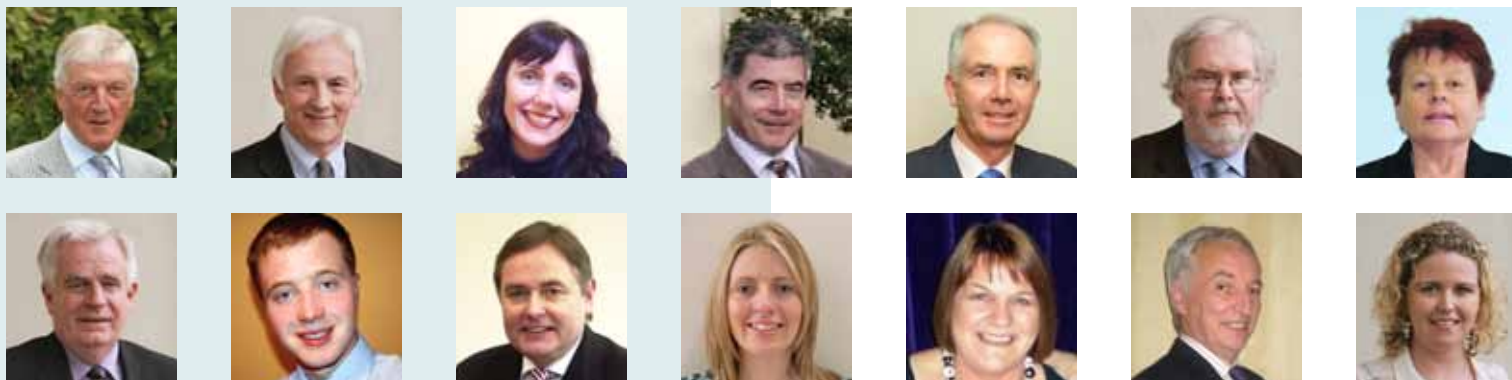

Tuaisceart Éireann

Arís, le linn 2009, d'fhás an Gradam i dTuaisceart Éireann agus lean an comhoibriú idir Gaisce – Gradam an Uachtaráin agus an Gradam *Duke of Edinburgh*.

Le comhpháirtíocht an dá Ghradam déantar líon gníomhaíochtaí a sholáthar don chlár 'Ag Trasnú Droichead' atá go bunúsach mar thionscadal um thógáil ar athmhuintearas agus caidreamh pobail atá lonnaithe i Mórcheantar Bhéal Feirste ina bhfuil 8 ngrúpa óige i gceist – 4 cinn i gceantair náisiúnacha Iarthar Bhéal Feirste agus 4 cinn i gceantair dílseoirí Dheisceart agus Oirthear Bhéal Feirste. Tá 96 duine óg ann a bhí ag obair ar na gnéithe sin den Ghradam a fheileann don rannpháirtíocht i ngrúpaí agus, nuair nach raibh an Gradam á mbaint amach acu, bhí baint acu le gníomhaíochtaí eile a bhí beartaithe chun an comh-mheas a mhéadú ar chultúir agus ar thraidisiúin a chéile.

Cuireadh oiliúint ar na PALanna a bhí i gceist chun iad a réiteach ionas go mbeidh siad in ann déileáil le saincheistanna conspóideacha agus tá forbairt á déanamh ar an tionscadal le go mbeadh sé mar shamhail an-éifeachtúil d'obair um chaidreamh pobail. Bhí ról lárnach ag Stephen Hughes, a dhéanann Club Óige Corpus Christi a bhainistiú, agus an tionscadal seo á fhorbairt agus, in éineacht le duine de na chéad rannpháirtithe, Conor Captain, chuir siad an clár i láthair ag Comhdháil Idirnáisiúnta ar bheartas don óige a bhí ar siúl in Windsor go luath in 2009. Bhí na scéalta a thug Conor ar a chuid taithí mar bhuaicphointe na comhdhála.

I mí an Mheithimh 2009, bronnadh 49 duine óg leis na Gradaim Airgid agus Cré-Umha den *Duke of Edinburgh* agus de Ghradam an Uachtaráin le linn searmanais an-speisialta i mBaile an Irbhinigh i gCo. Fhear Manach a d'eagraigh Bord Oideachais agus Leabharlann an Iarthair. Bhronn William Sayers, comhalta de Choiste Comhairleach Thuaisceart Éireann den Ghradam *Duke of Edinburgh*, agus Barney Callaghan ó Gaisce Gradaim ar dhaoine óga ó scoileanna agus grúpaí óige ar fud Fhear Manach agus Thír Eoghain.

D'imigh Eric Rainey ar scor tar éis seirbhís saoil a thabhairt don Ghradam agus guímid gach sonas air sa todhchaí. Tá Kate Thompson ceaptha mar an Stiúrthóir nua agus bhí sí gníomhach mar oibrí deonach sa Ghradam *Duke of Edinburgh* thar na blianta agus bhí baint aici le himeacht Óir na Mílaoise in 1999. Guímid gach rath uirthi agus táimid ag súil go mór le bheith ag obair léi amach anseo.

Northern Ireland

The year 2009 was another one of growth in the Award in Northern Ireland and continuing co-operation between Gaisce – The President's Award and the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

The Joint Award has provided a core of activities for the Crossing Bridges programme which is essentially a reconciliation and community relations building project located in the Greater Belfast area involving 8 youth groups – 4 in nationalist areas of West Belfast and 4 in loyalist areas of South and East Belfast. 96 young people have been working on those elements of the Award that are suited to group participation and, when not completing the Award, have been involved in other activities which have been planned to increase mutual respect for each other's culture and traditions.

The PALs involved have undergone training to equip them to deal with contentious issues and the project is developing into a very effective model for community relations work. Stephen Hughes, who manages Corpus Christi Youth Club, has played a key role in developing this project and he, together with one of the first participants, Conor Captain, presented the programme to an International Conference on youth policy held in Windsor in early 2009. Conor's reflections on his experiences of the Award were a highlight of the conference.

In June 2009, 49 young people were presented with Silver and Bronze Duke of Edinburgh and President's Awards during a very special ceremony, in Irvinestown, Co. Fermanagh organised by the Western Education and Library Board. Awards were presented to young people from schools and youth groups across Fermanagh and Tyrone by William Sayers, a member of the Northern Ireland Advisory Committee of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award and Barney Callaghan from Gaisce.

Eric Rainey retired after a lifetime of service to the Award and we wish him great happiness in the future. Kate Thompson is the new Director she has been active as a volunteer in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award over a number of years and was involved in the Millennium Gold event in 1999. We wish her well and look forward to working with her in the future.

International

Gaisce remains a fully accredited and highly respected member of the Duke of Edinburgh's International Award Association (IAA): the umbrella and standards body for Award schemes operating in 129 countries and territories Worldwide. Gaisce was elected for a three year term as a member of the Council of the IAA representing the European, Mediterranean and Arab States (EMAS) region of the Association. Gaisce Award holders from the North and South of Ireland participated in the planning and delivery of a European conference on youth policy involving academic and political leaders from European countries. Dr. Maurice Devlin, a senior lecturer in the Department of Applied Social Studies at NUI Maynooth participated in the conference. The first payment of the Stg£8,000 International Special Projects Grant was expended on developing a train the trainers programme for members of partner organisations to train their own President's Award Leaders (PALs). Gaisce Award holders participated in EMAS region activities in the UK, Iceland, Turkey, The Czech Republic, Slovenia and Finland. A Gold Award holder and Tar Éis Óir member took a lead role in developing the Award for the first time in Kosovo. Gaisce was represented at the IAAs World Forum in Sydney by two Gold Award holders and the Chief Executive. It was also represented at the International Council annual meeting.

Award Activities During the Year

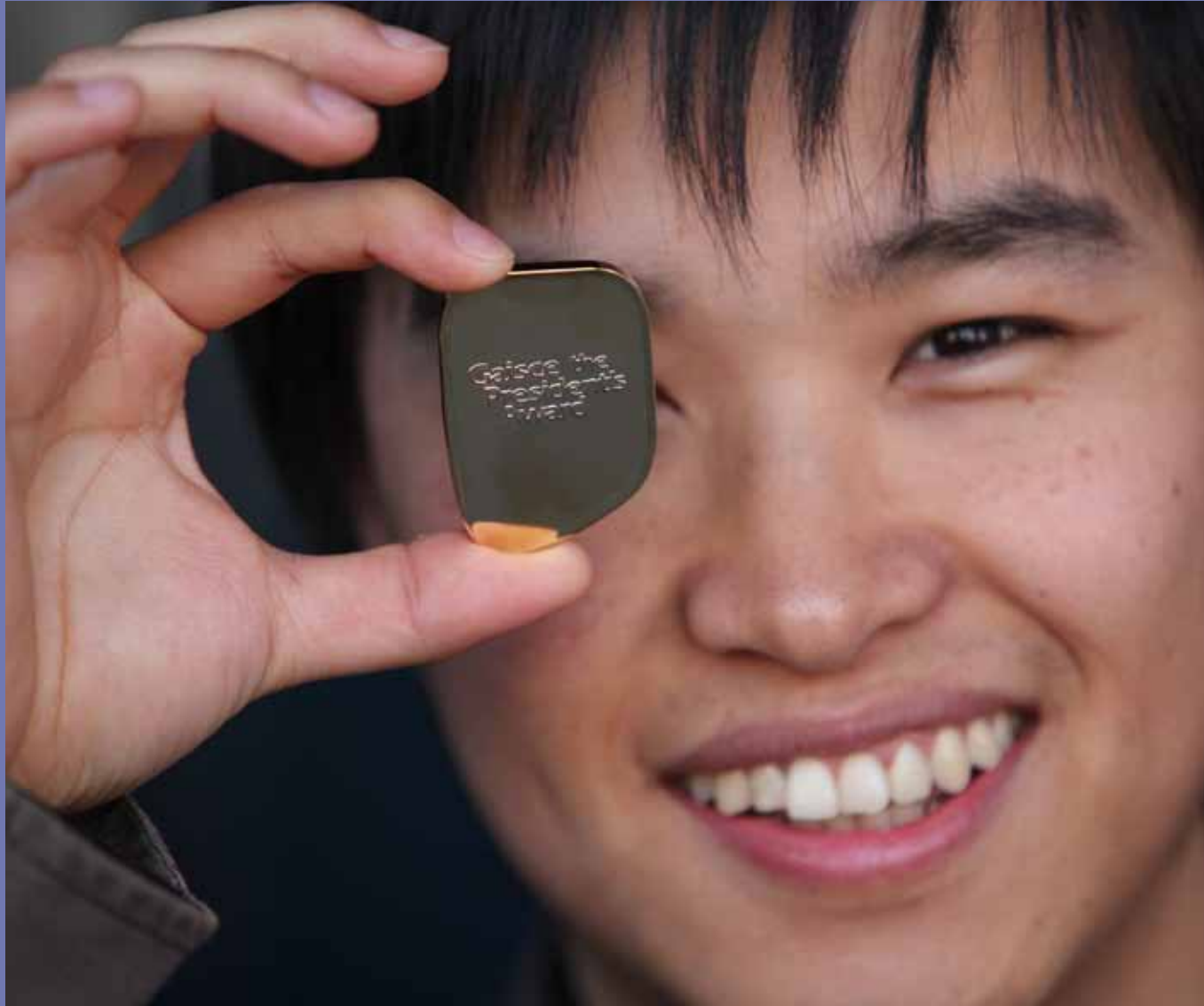
Defence Forces Adventure Programme

Quality Assurance

Quality Assurance

The first phase of a quality assurance programme was completed during the year and saw the introduction of a residential project and a formal agreement process for activities for the Gold Award. The Award now offers greater flexibility and choice to participants and President’s Award Leaders (PALs) and improves the probability of a young person completing the Award. A merit system was introduced which gives a six month credit to both a Bronze Award holder towards a Silver Award and a Silver Award holder towards a Gold Award. The new PALs training workshop format is now well established and has been the subject of much positive feedback during the year. A total of 148 PALs completed the workshop during the year. The PALs remain the key to the success of Gaisce and they play a significant part in the delivery of Gaisce’s quality personal development programme for young people. During the year a Quality Assurance Committee was formed and they have been active on the Quality agenda.

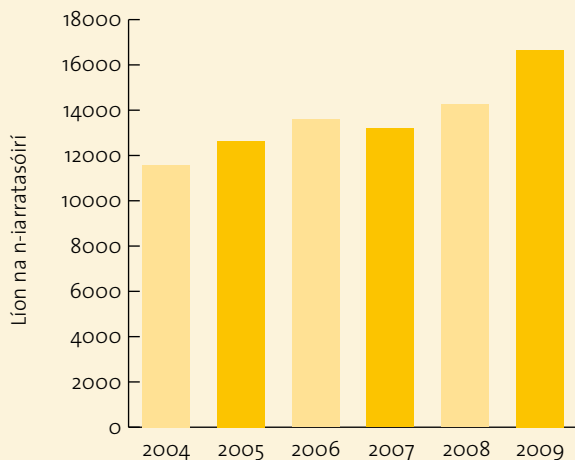

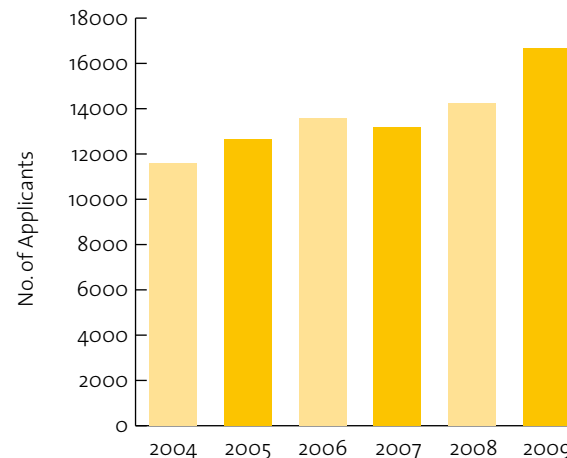

Governance

Audited accounts and the Annual Report for 2008 were delivered within the first half of the year and work on enhancing all aspects of Human Resource policy and procedure was progressed.
