A word from the Chairperson

On behalf of the Council of Gaisce - The President's Award, I am pleased to present the organisation's 2021 Impact Report.

The purpose of the Gaisce Awards programme is to provide young people with an opportunity, through participation in personal, physical, community and group challenges, to learn about themselves and the world around them and the role they can play in making it better.

In essence, Gaisce aims to provide the environment in which they can unlock their own potential and be the best version of themselves.

As I observe the world around me now in the latter half of 2022, Gaisce - The President's Award has never been more relevant or necessary. Earlier this year we were in position to respond speedily to support the young cohorts of Ukrainian refugees arriving to Irish shores, adapting our 'Wavelength' programme for refugees, migrants and those seeking international protection. We also quickly updated relevant materials across languages to connect with local community organisations on the ground. The work by the Gaisce team and structures developed in 2021 allowed us to reach these young people now, and we are absolutely committed to continuing to do so.

In 2021, we were delighted to see an increase in both the number of young people registering for their Gaisce Award, and the numbers of Gaisce Awards achieved overall.

The organisation was particularly pleased that, despite the challenges of Covid-19, diversity and inclusion projects were able to progress, and we appreciate and are grateful for the generous support of funders in this regard.

I wish to thank and commend **Minister Roderic O'Gorman** and officials within the **Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth (DCEDIY)** for securing vital funding for young people who are particularly affected by Covid-19, as well as support the DCEDIY was able to provide for Gaisce's 35th anniversary biodiversity campaign, Bulbs for Bees.

I also wish to thank Minister O'Gorman for opening the first LGBTI+ exhibition at the National Gallery of Ireland 'Queer Mind, Body and Soul' created by Gaisce's LikeMinded programme participants.

Finally, we are indebted to President Michael D. Higgins and officials within Áras an Uachtaráin for their continued support and engagement. It is our pleasure to carry out our work on his behalf.

A message from the CEO

A Gaisce Award is far more than a medal and certificate: it is physical representation of the personal growth of a young person and the development of vital social and emotional competencies, from confidence and self-management to resilience and empathy. Each Award represents an individual story for a young person to share and reflect on.

Thanks to the agility and energy of colleagues in Gaisce, the tireless effort and commitment of President's Award Leaders (PALs) and the sheer resilience of young people, there was a 3% increase in the number of young people registering for Gaisce in 2021 and an **increase of 36% in the number of young people achieving a Gaisce Award.**

Given completion rates were particularly affected by Covid in 2020, this recovery is as welcome as it is significant.

More than 21,700 young people registered for Gaisce in 2021 and 12,500 Gaisce Awards were achieved. **The Gaisce Award programme relies on individuals and organisations that share both our belief in - and ambition for - young people. More than 1,300 President's Award Leaders, working and volunteering across 775 Gaisce Award Partner organisations supported young people through their Gaisce journey in 2021.** In the context of a second year of Covid-related restrictions, we consider this a phenomenal number and remain ever grateful for their support of the Gaisce programme.



SUPPORTING A GROUP OF LGBTQIA+ YOUNG PEOPLE AND ALLIES TO ACHIEVE THEIR GAISCE AWARD

The LikeMinded group worked in collaboration with artist Shireen Shortt on modes of artistic expression across multiple disciplines and media, such as paper, written word, spoken word, dance, sculpture, paintings, drawing, photography, mixed media, sculpture, animation, singing, body art, performance, installation art, and embroidery. These forms were used to express a variety of experiences and emotions felt by the group, which they feel also represents the experiences of many LGBTQIA+ and gender non-conforming young people today. Their work focused on the importance of the mind, body and soul of a young LGBTQIA+ person in 2021.

These works formed Queer Mind, Body and Soul, an exhibition in partnership with the National Gallery of Ireland. The exhibition ran between 30th July and 17th October 2021 in the Millennium Wing Studio of the National Gallery and had over 30,000 visitors.

Wavelength Learning and Idea Exchange' took place on March 31 st . 82 people registered for the event, and it generated in an increase of organisation and PALs wanting to get involved in the project.

Gaisce hosted an online Residential across two weekends in June. Wavelength participants engaged alongside those also doing the Gold Award from across Ireland.

To mark World Refugee Day, we partnered with Bohemian Football club and launched the art competitions called "Dreamball Challenge".

In November 2021, Gaisce organised FutureTalks - a five-part event created for Wavelength participants to explore future education and career paths and learn about how they can make their voices heard, as part of their Community Involvement challenge. Live translation was available for all attendees.

Addressing and engaging in the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) is a core action within our Gaisce - The President's Award strategic plan. We created a bespoke training programme for PALs to equip them with the knowledge and skills to run a 13-week programme with their Bronze participants learning about Global Citizenship and working as a group on action-based community projects. This project will culminate in a showcase from the participants about their projects in 2022. Gaisce is uniquely placed to encourage young people to consider and question the world around them and the role they can play in creating a more just and equal society.

Just the Two of Us

A partnership with the Research Evidence into Policy, Programmes and Practice (REPPP) unit at the University of Limerick's School of Law.

In November, Gaisce ran an information sharing and networking event for the youth justice sector in Ireland. Highlights included looking at the vital importance of the relationship between a youth justice worker and young person; and an assessment of how the Gaisce programme aligns with this. Keynote speaker, Eoin O'Meara Daly (REPPP) presented on the topic and participants were invited into breakout rooms to discuss further.'

Story Exchange Project:

A Partnership with The Mountjoy Progression

Unit and Maynooth University Access Programme

Building on the success of the Story Exchange project in 2020 when young people in custody in Mountjoy Prison's Progression Unit and young people in Maynooth University were brought together to work towards achievement of a Gaisce Award. The project was a series of peer-to-peer empathy-building workshops, aiming to challenge stereotypes and create a sense of shared endeavour. In 2021, due to restrictions, a virtual Story Exchange between 4 Maynooth Ambassadors and 4 prisoners doing their Gaisce Awards took place. Both the students and young people from the Progression Unit shared brave and honest stories and whilst it was not the preferred option it was a powerful experience for those present.

GOLD AWARDS IN CUSTODY

2021 saw 11 Gold Award completions in custody - the largest number in the history of the Award to date. President Michael D. Higgins was able to present two Gold Award medals in person in Cork prison. Director General of the IPS, Caron McCaffery, and CEO of Gaisce, Yvonne McKenna, were present and spoke of the significance of the presentation to the two young men and for all who work to support Gaisce across the entire Prison Estate.

BULBS FOR BEES

'Bulbs For Bees' was a nationwide project established as part of Gaisce - The President's Award's 35th anniversary. The campaign was a call-to-action for everyone in Ireland regardless of age, location, or size of windowsill or back garden to take up their own Gaisce challenge during Autumn 2021 to plant a pollinator-friendly bulb and protect one of the most important players in the climate change battle - bees. We highlighted the campaign message that a small action can have a significant impact if we all work together, encompassing the values of Gaisce.


The All Ireland Pollinator plan worked in conjunction with Gaisce to ensure the campaign promoted the planting of pollinator friendly bulbs.

In all, more than half a million bulbs were distributed and planted across Ireland. Members of the public were also encouraged to purchase pollinator friendly bulbs from their local garden centres during the campaign adding significantly to the numbers of bulbs planted across the country.

MEDIA REACH

Bulbs For Bees achieved substantial coverage in local and national media via print, radio, TV, and digital including coverage on RTE's Today Show. In total, the campaign was featured 70 times across 45 different local and national media outlets with an estimated reach of 3.4million people. Several well-known media personalities supported the campaign including Eanna Ni Lamhna, Duncan Stewart and author Sarah Breen.

The campaign generated 6,300 interactions across Twitter with an estimated reach of 2.9million. On Facebook, the campaign generated 266 interactions with a reach of 130.4k. A photography competition running throughout the campaign was also well received by the public with entries being shortlisted down to 15. The photography competition winners were chosen by Éanna Ní Lamhna.
