GAISCE -THE PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Gaisce – The President's Award is Ireland's national youth award and is a personal development programme for young people aged 14-25. It is a direct challenge from the President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins, to all young people to dream big and realise their potential.

Over 520,000 young people have participated in Gaisce since 1985.

Gaisce encourages and rewards young people to discover their passions and challenge themselves to positively impact the world around them. It empowers participants to cultivate essential life skills and foster a sense of responsibility and resilience through a nationally and internationally recognised non-formal education framework. The programme also supports young people in becoming more active citizens and making a positive impact in their communities during the critical stage of life from adolescence into adulthood.

The Gaisce Award programme has three Award Levels, starting with Bronze and progressing to Silver and Gold. For each award, participants must undertake Challenge Area activities in Personal Skill, Community Involvement and Physical Recreation, along with an Adventure Journey.

Young people are guided by more than **1,300 adult mentors**, President's Award Leaders (PALs) supporting young people on the Award journey, encouraging young people to progress through the three Award levels.

PALs support Awardees in Gaisce Award Partner organisations: secondary schools, third level institutions, second-chance and further education services, youth services, disability organisations, sporting organisations, uniformed organisations, youth justice, prison and probation services, organisations working with young refugees and asylum seekers, and more.

Gaisce – The President's Award was established in 1985 to mark the UN's International Year of Youth and was launched in Áras an Uachtaráin by President, Dr. Patrick J. Hillery, Gaisce's founding patron.

In 2005, prompted by the Good Friday Agreement's commitments, young individuals in Northern Ireland gained access to the Gaisce Award through the Joint Award Initiative (JAI), a partnership between Gaisce, Duke of Edinburgh Award and Duke of Edinburgh International Award.

Gaisce Awards are recognised as valuable non-formal education certification in more than 130 countries through our partnership with The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRPERSON

On behalf of the Council of Gaisce - The President's Award, I am pleased to present the 2024 report.

"Spark change and inspire hope," concluded the speech of President Michael D Higgins at the Gaisce Gold Award ceremony in Áras an Uachtaráin in November 2024. His audience was 73 young people from across Ireland, representing disability groups, youth groups, migrant groups, LGBTQ+ groups, schools and community-based organisations that Gaisce works with every day.

President Higgins reminded us on that day of the importance of the Raymond Williams quote: "Be the arrow, not the target". To be active and not passive when it comes to moments of challenge and change. To lead the change you want to see in the world around you, rather than assume others will chart that course.

This beloved quote of President Higgins will now form the basis of a 2025 call to action for people - of all ages - to undertake a challenge to mark the 40th anniversary of Gaisce. It comes also as we enter the final mile of President Higgins' second term in office.

And so as we prepare for a final year of activities with President Higgins as our patron, I would like to thank Mr Higgins and his wife Sabina Higgins for their constant support and empowerment of young people, helping them realise the meaning of active purposeful citizenship on the island of Ireland today.

The President's "Be the Arrow" refrain serves as a reminder that in a world of constant change and disruption, Gaisce is a stabilising force for good in the lives of our young people in all of their individual diversity and brilliance.

I consider myself fortunate to have met many Gaisce awardees from across our rural and urban school ecosystem, from youth justice programmes, from traveller communities, and so many extraordinary young people with the most complex learning needs. Each of them has received awards in recognition of their skills, strengths, persistence and resilience. Each of them are equal and extraordinary awardees of Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards.

None of this would be possible without our patron President Higgins and his team at Áras an Uachtaráin, the team at the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth led by Minister Roderic O'Gorman, the Gaisce CEO Avril Ryan and her entire team across the country, our ambassadors, PALs and volunteers, our Council members new, current and those whose terms have recently come to an end, in addition to the parents and guardians of our young people who have helped them realise a springboard opportunity that can propel them to greater levels of confidence, selfactualisation, social impact.

We look forward to engaging with candidates contesting an election to become the 10th president of Ireland in November 2025 and connecting them with a new strategic vision for Gaisce spanning 2026 - 2030.

At a time when Ireland boasts the youngest population in Europe, I believe Gaisce can be at the forefront of efforts to make Ireland the best country in the world to be a young person.

In 2025 and beyond, Gaisce will continue to serve our young people with an innate sense of purpose and ambition for them, while copper fastening our commitment to the highest standards of excellence.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

In 2024, Gaisce – The President's Award continued to transform the lives of young people through our nationally and internationally recognised non-formal education award under our youth development framework.

Our programme's emphasis on self-directed, non-competitive goal-setting fosters confidence and a can-do attitude, building self-belief and ensuring that young individuals aged 14 to 25 are equipped to navigate life's opportunities and challenges. Now more than ever, the Award opens doors to possibility delivering positive youth development outcomes, recognising achievements beyond the classroom, and providing young people with the tools and experiences to thrive in education, careers, and life.

Collaboration remains at the heart of Gaisce's success. Through strong partnerships across diverse youth settings, the Gaisce Awards provide young people with transformative opportunities, broadening their horizons and changing lives. We extend our deepest gratitude to the many partner organisations that believe in young people and in the power of working together to help young people discover their own potential.

Our work in 2024 was guided by the organisation's Strategic Plan 2022-2025, which is built on three key pillars: Build on Achievement, Tell Our Story and Excellence in What We Do. I am pleased to report that our 2024 work plan delivered and exceeded expectations across all strategic pillars.

2024 Strategic Achievements included:

- Establishment of Gaisce's Youth Ambassador Programme in November 2024. This dynamic group of 12 Awardees provides invaluable insights into the impact of Gaisce, serving as advocates for young people nationwide. More importantly, they embody the Award's spirit, ensuring that young people from all backgrounds can see themselves reflected in Gaisce through the voices and experiences of our Ambassadors.
- One of the standout moments of 2024 was recognising our President's Award Leaders (PALs). Our PAL Appreciation Awards in Farmleigh celebrated the dedication of 24 PALs, who received civic merit awards for their outstanding contributions. This event was further amplified by our

PAL Appreciation Month, during which we shared and celebrated the inspiring stories of the more than 1,300 PALs who deliver the Gaisce Awards. Their dedication to supporting young people in reaching their potential is invaluable, and without their efforts, the Gaisce programme would not be the success it is today.

- The highest participation in the Award was achieved, with almost 27,000 young people starting out on their Gaisce Awards at all levels, demonstrating continued growth and access being realised.
- More young people accessed the programme with the support of our Gaisce SUAS Bursaries, benefiting 2,015 young people from 87 Gaisce Award Partners, reducing barriers to participation in DEIS schools, disability services, youth services, youth justice services, and more.
- Heightened collaboration with our partners in The Duke of Edinburgh's Award on the Joint Award Initiative, ensuring that more young people know they can choose a Gaisce Award in Northern Ireland. In 2024, we celebrated 25 years of this partnership with events in Hillsborough, Armagh, and Belfast.

- We continued to expand our digital platforms and enhance both virtual and in-person engagement, increasing our reach and improving efficiencies. Additionally, Gaisce strengthened its commitment to inclusivity and diversity by amplifying youthled stories and visual resources across our communications platforms, ensuring the Award's benefits resonate with a broad spectrum of stakeholders.
- Other groundbreaking projects and activities that have amplified and increased Award participation include: Breath of Fresh Eire and Outreach, a creative project with Oberstown and Balbriggan Garda station; Direct registration fee support to Youth Diversion Projects by the Department of Justice; Award activity through poetry in Mountjoy Prison, in partnership with Poetry Ireland; Expansion of Approved Adventure Journey Providers, supporting quality Adventure Journey delivery for PALs; Development of the Gaisce Learning Hub, providing resources and learning for PALs in one space; **Expansion of Gaisce** implementation teams in prisons, in partnership with the Irish Prison Service; The many local and national ceremonies and campaigns including the Gold Award Ceremony in Áras an Uachtaráin and Lá Gaisce which gets everyone involved in Gaisce doing something special to celebrate the Awards.

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the current members of the Gaisce Council, whose generosity, expertise, and commitment continue to drive our mission forward. I also want to commend the Gaisce Team for their dedication, innovation, and passion in fostering a collaborative and dynamic organisational culture that delivers our mission, vision, and values.

2025 marks a significant milestone —Gaisce's 40th Anniversary—as well as the final year of President Michael D. Higgins' tenure in office. President Higgins and Sabina have been unwavering champions of Gaisce and its participants and Awardees since 2011, and their legacy of support for young people will be remembered and cherished for years to come.

I look forward to celebrating 40 years of Gaisce in 2025 with as many people as possible to continue advancing our mission of transforming young people's lives.

These young people, many of whom came through access and inclusion pathways, were honoured for their outstanding commitment to personal development and contribution to society, and I enjoyed celebrating this special occasion with them.

Finally, I would like to welcome the young people who are now embarking on their Gaisce experience. Last year was the highest number of registrations and completions in Gaisce's history, demonstrating the importance and popularity of the Award throughout the country, and I wish all those embarking on their journey every success and look forward to hearing about their Gaisce Award activities and the outcomes of their participation.

Gaisce SUAS Bursary Fund: Expanding Access and Opportunity

In September 2023, Gaisce – The President's Award proudly launched the Gaisce SUAS Bursary Fund, a transformative initiative designed to increase participation in the Gaisce Award programme among young people facing marginalisation or challenging life circumstances. By reducing financial barriers, the SUAS Fund aims to ensure that all young people have the opportunity to realise their potential through the Gaisce journey.

Thanks to a total bursary fund of

€84,000

the programme was delivered through two key funding streams:

- Uplift, supported by the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth
- Youth Justice, supported by a private philanthropic partner

We were proud to support

86 organisations

across Ireland through the Gaisce SUAS Bursary Fund in its inaugural year.

The **UPLIFT FUND** awarded

€50,235 in grants to 56 organisations,

including DEIS schools, special schools, disability services, and youth organisations.

The YOUTH JUSTICE FUND provided

€33,725 in support to 30 organisations,

including youth diversion and probation projects, the Oberstown Children Detention Campus, the Irish Prison Service, and other youth justice initiatives.

SUAS Fund Launch

To mark the launch of the SUAS Fund, Gaisce produced a promotional video highlighting the powerful stories of four organisations that had previously benefited from bursary support. These stories underscore the profound impact of accessible youth development opportunities.

Pathways to Potential: Gaisce's Work in Youth Justice

Gaisce – The President's Award remains deeply committed to promoting equality of access, and our work in the area of Youth Justice is a cornerstone of this mission. In 2024, we undertook two significant public-facing initiatives that underscored the transformative impact of the Gaisce Award within the Youth Diversion sector.

Amplifying Youth Voices Through Storytelling

In collaboration with two independent Youth Diversion Projects – **KEEP and CLAY** Gaisce produced a compelling video featuring three young participants undertaking their Gold Award Adventure Journey in Achill, Co. Mayo. The video served as a powerful testament to the personal growth, resilience, and achievement fostered through the Gaisce programme.

To ensure the safety and dignity of the young people involved, two versions of the video were created: one for internal use that included participant identities, and a second version with identities protected for broader public engagement. This approach reflects Gaisce's unwavering commitment to safeguarding and ethical storytelling.

Sector Recognition and National Engagement

Gaisce's impact in the Youth Diversion space was further recognised through an invitation to present at the **2024 National Youth Diversion Conference**. Central to this presentation was the inclusion of youth voices—two of the young people featured in the video joined Gaisce CEO Avril Ryan and Keith O'Driscoll, Project Leader with the KEEP Project, to share their experiences. The video was also showcased, helping to bring their stories to life and ensuring Gaisce's presentation stood out for its authenticity and youth-led narrative.

Strengthening Partnerships for Greater Reach

Our strategic partnership with the Department of Justice continues to flourish. In 2024, registration support for Youth Diversion Projects expanded significantly — from 12 projects in 2023 to 26. This growth reflects both the increasing demand for the Gaisce programme within the sector and the strength of our collaborative approach to supporting young people in achieving their potential.



"When I first took on the Gaisce Programme to Kilmore I was expecting fixed programmes expectations, additional administrative tasks and high levels of accountability. However, it was the complete opposite - Gaisce staff are approachable & friendly. They were completely flexible, 0% additional administration tasks, fluid in approaches and very easy to implement. The outcomes for young people were remarkable. It promoted participation, gave positive reinforcement to young people who never received validation, increased voluntary

participation, inner confidence, self-esteem and presented opportunities to marginalised young people who may never have had opportunities.



Enhancing Access Through Gaeilge and New Supports and Resources at Gaisce

Gaisce continues to strengthen its commitment to the Irish language through the development of inclusive and accessible resources for participants and PALs (President's Award Leaders). In 2024, several key initiatives were undertaken to enhance Irish language provision across the organisation:

Launch of a Fully Integrated Irish Language Website

A dedicated Irish language version of the Gaisce website was developed, ensuring that Irish-speaking participants and stakeholders can access information and resources in their preferred language.

Expansion of Irish Language Communications Supports

A range of communications access supports were introduced to facilitate greater engagement with Irish-speaking communities and to promote bilingualism across Gaisce's platforms.

Online Learning and Upskilling for PALs

As part of Gaisce's Learning Development strategy, an online learning space was established to support PALs in deepening their understanding of the Gaisce Award. Completion of a brief online introduction course is now a requirement for all new PALs, with additional supporting modules available on the platform.

Dedicated Irish Language Resource Library

A new Irish language section has been added to the PALs' resource hub, providing access to Irish versions of all key Gaisce materials. This ensures that PALs working in Irish- medium or bilingual settings are fully supported in delivering the programme.

Think Global, Act Local: Advancing Global Citizenship through the Gaisce Award

As part of Gaisce's ongoing commitment to promoting Global Citizenship Education (GCE), the standalone event

Think Global, Act Local: Global Citizenship

through the Gaisce Award was held with the support of Irish Aid. This initiative aimed to deepen the understanding and engagement of President's Award Leaders (PALs) in global citizenship themes, while showcasing Gaisce's efforts to embed GCE within its programme.

Think Global, Act Local

The event brought together PALs, international collaborators, and Gaisce partners to explore the opportunities, challenges, and benefits of **global citizenship education**. Attendees engaged in dynamic discussions and heard from leading voices in the field, including keynote speaker Oisín Coghlan, CEO of Friends of the Earth. Oisín shared insights from his work in climate and environmental justice, emphasizing the critical role of youth empowerment in addressing global challenges.

The event welcomed

32 participants from

Seven countries

and received overwhelmingly positive feedback, reinforcing the value of fostering global awareness and action through the Gaisce Award framework.

Participants also learned from impactful case studies presented by Lourdes Youth & Community Services (LYCS) and the Global Youth Mobilisation Project, which illustrated how young people and PALs have meaningfully engaged with global citizenship through their Gaisce or International Award journeys.



Gold Residential: Exploring Global Citizenship in Action

Gaisce hosted a Global Citizenship-themed Gold Residential event, spanning five days and four nights, in collaboration with the University of Galway and Gaisce's headquarters at Ratra House. Seventeen Gold Award participants took part in this immersive experience, designed to deepen their understanding of global citizenship while fostering meaningful peer connections.

Over two weekends, participants engaged in a rich programme of activities, including expert-led talks, interactive workshops, and a spirited Global Citizenship debate. These sessions provided a platform for critical thinking, collaboration, and reflection on global issues. A core aim of the Residential was to build community among Gold Participants from across Ireland, and this event successfully created space for those connections to flourish.



This project was supported by funding from the DCEDIY Climate Justice Fund and Irish Aid.

Guest speakers included Stephen Ucembe of Tearfund, a community advocate from Kenya, and Chris Nolan, an Environmental Youth Worker based in Galway. Participants also took part in a workshop facilitated by Eimear Manning from the National Youth Council of Ireland (NYCI), which focused on youth engagement in global issues.

In Dublin, the group was joined by four young people from KARE, an organisation supporting individuals with intellectual disabilities. They presented projects to the group they had worked on which covered a number of the SDGs. These participants were fully integrated into the programme and proudly received certificates of completion for their Gold Residential, highlighting Gaisce's commitment to inclusion and accessibility.



Championing Global Citizenship through Action and Engagement

As part of Gaisce's commitment to embedding Global Citizenship Education (GCE) across its programme, participants engaged in a wide range of themed activities aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

These activities were structured around the five key pillars of sustainable development:



This framework helped participants explore global issues through a local lens, fostering a deeper understanding of interconnected global challenges.

In addition to these thematic activities, Gaisce participants made a remarkable contribution to their communities through the Community Involvement challenge area of the Award, collectively dedicating over 347,000 hours to volunteering.

These efforts reflect the core values of active citizenship, empathy, and leadership that underpin the Gaisce Award, and demonstrate the powerful impact of youth-led community involvement across Ireland.

PILLAR 2: TELL OUR STORY



Breath of Fresh Eire launch at Balbriggan Garda Station March 2024

Breath of Fresh Éire: Creativity, Connection, and Community

Breath of Fresh Éire was a powerful and creative collaboration between Gaisce – The President's Award, Oberstown Children Detention Campus, and An Garda Síochána Balbriggan. The initiative brought together young people from Oberstown and community Gardaí through a series of three interconnected art projects:

Life's Patterns, Breath of Fresh Éire, and Outreach



Led by renowned artist Joe Caslin, the project used art as a medium to foster empathy, build mutual understanding, and promote meaningful collaboration. Through a series of workshops, participants worked side by side to co-create impactful visual pieces as part of their Gaisce Award journey.

A key element of the project's success was the creation of a shared space for dialogue and connection. Using the **Narrative 4 Story Exchange methodology**, a Gaisce team member facilitated storytelling sessions that encouraged participants to listen deeply and see the world through each other's eyes—laying the foundation for trust and empathy between the young people and the Gardaí.

To capture and share the impact of the initiative, Gaisce produced a compelling impact video, which premiered at the project's launch event and was widely shared across partner platforms. Shorter versions were also created for social media, amplifying the project's reach and resonance. The initiative received national attention, with coverage on RTÉ's One O'Clock and Six One News bulletins, as well as RTÉ Online.



Celebrating Achievement: The 2024 Gaisce Gold Award Ceremony

In November, President Michael D. Higgins welcomed 74 exceptional young people to Áras an Uachtaráin to receive the prestigious Gaisce Gold Award. The ceremony honoured their outstanding commitment to personal growth, community involvement, and active citizenship through the Gaisce Award programme.



This year's Gold Awardees undertook a diverse range of projects and activities, reflecting the breadth of talent, resilience, and dedication among young people across Ireland. Their achievements are a powerful testament to Gaisce's mission to ensure that every young person—regardless of background—has the opportunity to participate and thrive. The event was hosted by acclaimed Irish actress and writer Tara Flynn, with an inspiring keynote address delivered by Gaisce Gold Award alumna Miriam Keegan. Now a successful fashion designer with a strong focus on sustainability, Miriam shared her journey and the lasting impact of her Gaisce experience.

The ceremony received widespread national and regional media coverage, including multiple radio interviews—an impressive outcome given the timing in the lead-up to the General Election. To ensure accessibility, the event was live-streamed, allowing families and President's Award Leaders (PALs) who couldn't attend in person to join the celebration. The accompanying impact video resonated strongly online, generating over 3,600 views across Gaisce's social media platforms.

Lá Gaisce: A National Celebration of Achievement and Pride







Gaisce in Schools: Empowering Young People Through Education

Post-primary schools continue to be the foundation of the Gaisce – The President's Award journey, with an outstanding 94% of all Awards completed within the school environment. These institutions serve as the first point of contact for most participants, igniting a lifelong commitment to personal growth and active citizenship.

Central to this success is the work of Gaisce's Development Officers, who cultivate strong partnerships with schools and President's Award Leaders (PALs) nationwide. Their dedication has firmly embedded Gaisce within the senior cycle curriculum, making it a recognised and valued element of student development.

While Transition Year (TY) remains a popular entry point, a growing number of schools are introducing Gaisce earlier. At Mount Sackville Secondary School, PAL Vivienne Meade launched the programme with second-year students, recognising the unique opportunity for early engagement.

"Second year is a pivotal time for personal growth,"
Vivienne explains. "Students are developing
independence and have the energy to embrace new
challenges before exam pressures begin. Gaisce builds
confidence, commitment, and citizenship from the
outset."

The initiative was met with enthusiasm. Students quickly embraced the programme's diversity, participating in activities such as a school sleepover and orienteering in Phoenix Park—experiences that fostered teamwork, joy, and lasting memories.

"Completing the Award gave students a real sense of pride," Vivienne reflects. "They became more confident, responsible, and community-minded. Many discovered new interests and developed essential life skills. A significant number are now pursuing the Silver Award."



Pipers Hill College in Naas, Co. Kildare has also successfully introduced Gaisce to second-year students. PAL Theresa Collins shares: "We saw interest from second years, especially those with siblings in TY. The timing aligned with the Junior Cycle Profile of Achievement, which recognises broader learning. Gaisce was a natural fit."

The results have been impressive. The school celebrated five Gold Award recipients last year, with seven more students currently progressing toward Gold. Silver Award participation has also grown, with 12 students awarded Silver last year and four more in May.

Impressive Results

This early engagement model supports a natural progression through the Award levels, allowing students to build on their achievements throughout TY and senior cycle. Many continue their journey into fifth and sixth year, balancing personal development with academic demands.

Eoin Moylan, a Gaisce Youth Ambassador preparing for his Leaving Certificate, began his journey in TY and is now completing his Silver Award. "It's more challenging with exams, but Gaisce gives me a break from study and a chance to focus on myself and my community," Eoin shares. "As the saying goes, 'If you want something done, ask a busy person.'"

Eoin champions the programme's value: "Gaisce is a challenge worth taking on. Every young person should have the chance to participate. I believe in the power of youth voices to shape the future. As the Irish seanfhocail says, Mol an óige agus tiocfaidh sí — praise the youth, and they will flourish."



The stories of Vivienne, Theresa, and Eoin highlight the transformative impact of Gaisce across the school journey. Whether introduced in second year, TY, or senior cycle, Gaisce continues to empower young people to grow, lead, and thrive—building a generation of confident, committed, and community-minded citizens.

Empowering Youth Voices:The Gaisce Youth Ambassador Panel

In 2024, Gaisce proudly launched its first-ever Youth Ambassador Panel, a long-term strategic goal brought to life through a nationwide recruitment campaign. This landmark initiative reflects Gaisce's commitment to youth leadership, inclusion, and co-creation.



The panel comprises 12 young people from across Ireland, each bringing unique perspectives, lived experiences, and a shared passion for the Gaisce Award. Representing a diverse cross-section of participants and awardees, the panel embodies the spirit of youth empowerment and the richness of Ireland's communities.

Running from 2024 through 2025, the Youth Ambassador Panel will engage in a wide range of learning and leadership opportunities facilitated by Gaisce. In return, the organisation benefits from the panel's insights, advocacy, and lived experience—helping to shape and strengthen Gaisce's programmes and outreach.

Since its formation, the panel has participated in workshops and seminars on key themes such as Global Citizenship, Leadership, Diversity and Inclusion, and Personal Development. Panel members also represent Gaisce at public events and actively share their journeys on social media, amplifying the voice of young people and inspiring others to take part.

Gaisce Defence Forces Challenge:

Adventure, Teamwork, and Resilience

In June 2024, the annual **Gaisce Defence Forces Challenge** marked its 36th year, offering a unique and transformative experience for 29 Bronze and Silver Award participants aged 15 to 17. Hosted by the Defence Forces, the four-day challenge combined adventure, discipline, and teamwork in a dynamic and immersive setting.

Participants engaged in a series of physically and mentally demanding activities across three key locations: Custume Barracks in Athlone, Carnagh Range in Roscommon, and The Curragh training camp. The programme included obstacle courses, rib boat travel, fieldcraft and survival workshops, and a 10km hike through the Slieve Bán Mountains—all designed to simulate aspects of life in the Defence Forces and push participants beyond their comfort zones.

This experience fulfilled the **Adventure Journey requirement** for the Bronze and Silver Gaisce Awards, while also fostering resilience, leadership, and camaraderie among the young people involved.

The event received significant national attention, with a double-page centre spread in The Irish Times on Saturday, 15th June, highlighting the impact and excitement of the challenge.

Strengthening Partnerships Through the Approved Adventure Journey Providers Initiative

Launched in 2023, Gaisce's Approved Adventure Journey Providers initiative continued to thrive throughout 2024, expanding its reach and deepening its impact. In collaboration with dedicated partners such as Ballyhass, we codeveloped tailored Gaisce programme experiences that enriched the Adventure Journey component for participants nationwide.

A highlight of the year was our **Showcase event** in October, which brought together a diverse range of Approved Adventure Journey Providers. Delivered online to Gaisce PALs across the country, the event spotlighted the unique offerings available through our partners and inspired PALs to explore new opportunities for their participants.

By growing our roster of Challenge Partners, we aimed to inspire participants with a broader range of ideas and accessible pathways to complete their Award journey.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to our Official Challenge Partners for their continued commitment. Their support not only enriches the Gaisce experience but also empowers young people to realise their potential through purposeful and rewarding activities.

Jigsaw is delighted to be collaborating with Gaisce as a Challenge Partner as part of our Neart programme of supports and resources for post-primary schools. As part of Neart we offer a 13 week programme for students called Take Action! which enables schools to fulfil the criteria for the Bronze Gaisce Award. So far, we have 347 schools enrolled in the Take Action! Programme.

As a result of this programme, 97% of participants undertaking the eLearning teacher training indicate that they have a greater understanding of mental health and 96% indicate that they have learned strategies to support their facilitation of mental health and wellbeing lessons for students in their school.

This partnership with Gaisce is a great addition to our Neart national programme of supports and enables us to offer a very comprehensive Gaiscerecognised programme which actively encourages student voice in action on mental health in schools.





Careers Portal



CareersPortal is delighted to celebrate the first year as a Gaisce Challenge Partner, through the National Career Skills Competition.

This exciting competition shines a spotlight on the importance of career skills and encourages students to explore their future through meaningful career research in the form of a Career Investigation. Participants reflect on the skills they developed during their work experience and demonstrate how these skills will serve them in their chosen career path.

Whether through a written entry or a creative vlog, students get the opportunity to showcase their learning, build digital literacy, develop strong communication and reflective thinking skills and demonstrate their career management skills.

Our partnership with Gaisce has helped develop enhanced awareness and participation in the competition across 2nd level schools, deepened engagement with employers offering work experience placements and increased the number of students using the competition as part of their Gaisce Award.

This collaboration not only strengthens young people's readiness for the world of work but also supports guidance counsellors and schools in delivering high-impact, evidence-based careers education. Feedback from the guidance community has been overwhelmingly positive, affirming the value of this initiative.

Together with Gaisce, CareersPortal is proud to be shaping a more skilled, informed, and career-ready generation of young people across Ireland.



2024 PAL Appreciation Awards

Honouring Dedication: 2024 Gaisce PAL Appreciation Awards

In January, Gaisce proudly hosted the **2024 PAL Appreciation Awards** at the historic Farmleigh House, celebrating the unwavering **commitment of President's Award Leaders (PALs) across Ireland**. The event recognised 24 PALs who have supported young people in achieving their Gaisce Awards for over five years, as well as retiring PALs and those who mentored Gold Awardees in 2023.



The PALs honoured on the day represented a wide range of organisations, including post-primary schools, youth services, prisons, and prison education centres—highlighting the diverse and inclusive reach of the Gaisce programme.

The ceremony featured two inspiring guest speakers: **Dr Tony Holohan, former Chief Medical Officer of Ireland**, and **Adam Donovan of Citywise Education**, who brought the youth perspective to the fore by speaking about the vital role PALs play in the lives of young people undertaking the Gaisce journey.

The event was hosted by actor and writer **Tara Flynn**, who brought warmth and energy to the celebration. The PAL Appreciation Awards are Gaisce's way of formally acknowledging the **dedication**, **mentorship**, **and passion that PALs** bring to the programme—ensuring that young people across Ireland are supported, encouraged, and empowered to reach their potential.

PAL Power:

Training, Resources and Recognition in 2024

Gaisce is proud to support a vibrant and growing network of President's Award Leaders (PALs), who play a vital role in guiding and mentoring young people on their Gaisce journey.

In 2024, we continued to invest in training, resources, and engagement opportunities to ensure PALs feel equipped, connected, and valued.

Training and onboarding

A total of 16 PAL training sessions were delivered throughout the year, welcoming 386 new PALs into the network. In total, Gaisce staff supported over 1,300 PALs across the country, providing guidance and encouragement as they facilitated the Award.

Listening and Learning

To better understand the needs and experiences of our PALs, we launched a new annual PAL Survey. With 153 responses, the feedback gathered is helping shape future supports and improvements in Award delivery.

Learning and Development

We enhanced our Learning Hub with new resources and online courses tailored to PALs. A dedicated **Adventure Journey Workshop** attracted 63 PALs, offering practical insights and peer learning opportunities.

Showcasing Opportunities

The newly introduced **Challenge Partner Showcase** brought together 111 PALs and participants to explore exciting ways to complete Award challenges through external partnerships.

Staying Connected

Our quarterly PAL Ezines kept the network informed and inspired, sharing updates on Gaisce news, events, and opportunities. These newsletters reached all active PALs, with a combined circulation of 14,882.
